Course Title: Essentials IV

Course Duration: 16 hours

Program: Fire Fighting Program

Course Prerequisites: Essentials I, II, and III

Course Description: The goal of this course is to give the student hands on experience with advanced firefighting methods such as Fire Ground Operations, SCBA's, Ground Ladders, Search and Rescue, Ventilation, Water Supply, and Safety.
